

South bank, Snape sluice to Iken Church and North bank, Snape sluice to higher ground at TM39174 57523

Location and direction of photographs

River walls are mown regularly. Some vestiges of old armour at base on river side plus reed protection.

South bank river walls downriver of Snape Bridge.

Concrete wharf edge at Maltings followed by short length of bank returning to concrete wall to building followed by bank to higher ground at car park. Bank is grass covered and regularly maintained.

Maltings to Jumbo's Cottage

Old river walls breeched since 1945; mudflats and reedbed with no dwellings between the 5 metre contour and the river

Jumbo's Cottage to Iken Cliff

Steep natural bank up to 5 metre contour running along river. Timber boarding protection to footpath along the riverside with mudflats and reedbed.

followed by length of saltmarsh to Iken Cliff. Some of the marsh at the west end is eroding with creeks and islands. Details logged to keep an eye on rate of erosion although from historical data, erosion appears to be slow.



Mud and sand at base of the cliff. Concrete and tyres as unofficial protection to the base of the cliff.

From historical data, it would appear that the area of sand at the bottom of the cliff is unchanged from1945.

Iken Cliff to Iken Church

The river wall runs from the rising ground at TM41144 56022 eastwards to Iken Church. It is well protected by saltings. It was not possible to walk the wall but from the west end at the footpath it appears to be covered in saplings for most of its length. In addition there is some erosion where the footpath crosses the wall.

North bank: Snape bridge to rising ground at wood at TM40121 57595

Historically the saltings from Snape bridge to the higher ground at the wood have been stable since 1945 with 40some accretion upriver from Blackheath sluice (TM39535 576).

The top of the river bank has recently been levelled with a hogging path presumably with a geotextile underlay. (How would hogging and underlay perform compared with grass in the event of overtopping?)

The bank is generally mown and maintained. Where there are no saltings, vestiges of timber and stone armour are visible on the front face.

There are areas of erosion through the old armour both upriver (picture 10) and downriver (picture 11) from the point at TM39688 57523.

On the inside of the bank between Blackheath Sluice and the point at TM39688 57523 there is considerable steepening of the upper slope, up to 45°. (This may be a productof the recent levelling work as the top of the bank was narrow and sloping before the levelling).


